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HIGHLIGHTS

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) in December 2014 **increased** by 1.6 per cent over November 2014. Compared with December 2013, the CPI **increased** by 1.2 per cent (**Table 1**).

The Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages Index increased by 0.1 per cent over November 2014. On a year-on-year basis, the Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages Index decreased by 0.5 per cent.

On the other hand, the Non-Food Index increased by 1.9 per cent over November 2014. Compared with the same month last year, the Non-Food Index was 1.6 per cent higher.

MONTH-ON-MONTH CHANGES (December 2014 compared to November 2014)

The CPI in December 2014 increased by 1.6 per cent over November 2014 (**Table 3**).

Based on the contribution to change, Transport contributed 88.8 per cent to the overall month-on-month increase of the CPI in December 2014. This was followed by Recreation and Culture (11.5 per cent); and Clothing and Footwear (2.5 per cent).

Increases were recorded in:

- **Transport** (7.4 per cent) due to higher cost of passenger transport by air;
- **Recreation and Culture** (2.0 per cent) due to higher prices of magazines and periodicals as well as package holidays/pilgrimages; and
- **Clothing and Footwear** (1.0 per cent) due to higher prices of clothing materials, several garments as well as other articles of clothing and clothing accessories.

Decreases were recorded in:

- **Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance** (0.5 per cent) due to lower cost of other household textiles, household appliances as well as glassware, tableware and household utensils;
- **Miscellaneous Goods and Services** (0.1 per cent) due to lower cost of travel goods and bags; and
- **Restaurants and Hotels** (less than 0.05 per cent) due to lower prices of selected food items from restaurants and cafes.

Meanwhile, indices for **Health**; **Communication** and **Education** remained unchanged.

YEAR-ON-YEAR CHANGES (December 2014 compared to December 2013)

The CPI in December 2014 increased by 1.2 per cent compared to the same month in 2013 (**Table 4**).

Based on the contribution to change, Transport contributed 43.4 per cent to the overall year-on-year increase of the CPI for December 2014. This was followed by Clothing and Footwear (22.2 per cent); and Miscellaneous Goods and Services (15.6 per cent).

Increases were recorded in:

- **Transport** (2.7 per cent) due to higher cost of spare parts and accessories of vehicles, lubricants and similar products as well as passenger transport by air;
- **Clothing and Footwear** (7.1 per cent) due to higher prices of clothing materials, several garments, other articles of clothing and clothing accessories as well as shoes and other footwear; and
- **Miscellaneous Goods and Services** (3.0 per cent) due to higher prices of articles for personal hygiene, beauty products, clocks and watches, travel goods and bags as well as other services.

Decreases were recorded in:

- **Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages** (0.5 per cent) due to lower prices of prices of rice and cereals (1.8 per cent), chicken (4.5 per cent), fish and seafood (1.2 per cent), oil and fats (0.7 per cent); sugar, jam, honey, chocolate and confectionery (0.5 per cent); other food products (0.5

per cent) as well as coffee, tea and cocoa (0.8 per cent);

- **Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels** (0.7 per cent) due to lower cost of rentals for housing as well as materials for the maintenance and repair of the dwelling; and
- **Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance** (0.5 per cent) due to lower cost of carpets and other floor coverings, other household textiles, household appliances as well as glassware, tableware and household utensils.

PERIOD-ON-PERIOD CHANGES (January-December 2014 compared to January- December 2013)

The average CPI for the twelve months (January to December) of 2014 decreased by 0.2 per cent compared to the same period in 2013 (**Table 5**).

Decreases were recorded in **Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages** (0.2 per cent); **Clothing and Footwear** (2.4 per cent); **Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels** (0.7 per cent); **Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance** (2.2 per cent); and **Recreation and Culture** (2.0 per cent).

On the other hand, increases were recorded in **Health** (0.4 per cent); **Transport** (0.4 per cent); **Communication** (0.1 per cent); **Education** (2.7 per cent); **Restaurant and Hotel** (2.0 per cent); and **Miscellaneous Goods and Services** (0.9 per cent).

Goods according to Durability and Services

Compared to November 2014, the index for durable, non-durable goods and services increased by 0.7, 0.1 and 4.0 per cent, respectively. Meanwhile, the index for semi-durable goods decreased by 1.6 per cent.

Compared to December 2013, the index for semi-durable, non-durable goods and services increased by 2.7, 0.1 and 4.7 per cent, respectively. Meanwhile, the index for durable goods decreased by 7.0 per cent (**Table 6**).

TECHNICAL NOTES ON THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

1. Concepts and Definitions

- 1.1 The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change of prices paid by the households for a fixed 'basket' of goods and services over a period of time. The 'basket' of goods and services represents the average consumption pattern of the majority of households in Brunei Darussalam and it is derived from the results of a Household Expenditure Survey. The CPI is solely a measure of price changes and not a measure of changes in general cost of living.
- 1.2 As the CPI reflects the average changes in the prices of consumption goods and services, it is mainly used as a measurement of the rate of inflation. The CPI is also used as a deflator of other economic series such as the conversion of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) from current price values to constant price values.
- 1.3 The CPI basket covers a wide range of goods and services, classified according to the United Nation's "**Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP)**". The goods and services are based on the final consumption expenditure of households. However, imputed rentals of owner-occupied housing and household expenditures abroad are excluded. Non-consumption expenditures such as donations, remittances, repayments of loans and purchase of real estate are also excluded.
- 1.4 The CPI can also be classified by the type of goods, according to their durability, and services, as follows:
- **Durable goods** : Goods that are used repeatedly or continuously over a long period of time (e.g. furniture, household equipment, vehicles)
 - **Semi-durable goods** : Goods that are used repeatedly but their expected lifetime use is less than for durables and their purchaser's value is significantly less (e.g. clothing, footwear, glassware, games, toys, household textiles)
 - **Non-durable goods** : Goods that are for single use only (e.g. food and drink)
 - **Services**: Services such as education, health, personal services.
- 1.5 The base year 2010 is used as the reference year for computing the weights of the CPI basket based on the results of the Household Expenditure Survey (HES) 2010/11. However, for the computation of price relatives, the average prices of the current month are compared with those of the previous month, instead of the average base year prices. The CPI calculation uses the chained index method, whereby the ratio of the average prices of the current month and the previous month is multiplied with the index value of the previous month.
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2. Measurement of Changes in the CPI

2.1 The following changes are measured for the CPI:

- **Month-on-month changes:** the percentage change between the current month over the previous month;
- **Year-on-year changes :** the percentage change between the current month and the same month in the previous year; and
- **Period-on-period changes:** the percentage change between the average index of the year-to-date compared to the same period the previous year. For example, the average index from January to June of the current year is compared to the average index from January to June the previous year.

2.2 The **contribution to change** column provides information on which goods or services have contributed most to the changes in the index. It is calculated by multiplying the weight of a particular item or group of items with the monthly change in the index for this item or group of items.

2.3 The annual inflation rate is taken as the percentage change between the annual index of the reference year and that of the previous year.

3. Rounding Figures

3.1 The indices and percentage changes will be published to one decimal place in the **CPI Reports**. However, the computation of percentage changes and contribution to changes are based on the unrounded index values.

4. Rebasing of CPI

4.1 The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Brunei Darussalam has now been revised and rebased. The weights for the new CPI series were derived from the results of the Household Expenditure Survey 2010/11. The new Jan 2010=100 CPI series now consists of 11 divisions.
