INDEKS HARGA PENGGUNA (IHP), NOVEMBER 2014

1. Indeks Harga Pengguna (IHP) bagi bulan November 2014 menurun 0.2 peratus berbanding Oktober 2014.
2. Penurunan sebanyak 1.4 peratus telah dicatatkan bagi Pengangkutan disebabkan oleh kos yang rendah bagi kenderaan dan perkhidmatan pengangkutan melalui udara. Makanan dan Minuman Ringan menurun sebanyak 0.2 peratus disebabkan harga yang rendah bagi ikan dan makanan laut segar, daging, kopi, teh dan koko. Rekreasi dan Kebudayaan juga menurun sebanyak 0.1 peratus disebabkan kos yang rendah bagi komputer dan aksesori komputer, perakam media, permainan dan hobi, barangan untuk binatang kesayangan, majalah dan bahan bacaan lain serta peralatan tulis dan lukisan.
3. Sementara itu, peningkatan sebanyak 0.6 peratus telah dicatatkan bagi Perhiasan, Peralatan Isi Rumah dan Penyelenggaraan Rutin Isi Rumah disebabkan oleh kos yang tinggi bagi tekstil isi rumah, barangan kaca, pinggan mangkuk dan kelengkapan isi rumah serta barangan isi rumah yang tidak tahan lama. Pelbagai Barangan dan Perkhidmatan juga meningkat sebanyak 0.5 peratus disebabkan harga yang tinggi bagi peralatan penjagaan diri yang bukan elektrik, barangan untk kebersihan diri, produk kecantikan serta barangan dan beg perjalanan. Restoran dan Hotel juga meningkat kurang dari 0.05 peratus

disebabkan oleh peningkatan harga bagi beberapa hidangan terpilih di restoran dan kafe serta perkhidmatan penginapan.

4. IHP bagi November 2014 menurun 1.3 peratus berbanding November 2013 yang mana sebahagian besarnya disebabkan oleh penurunan indeks Pengangkutan; Pakaian dan Kasut; dan Rekreasi dan Kebudayaan.
5. IHP ini adalah petunjuk bagi mengukur perubahan harga barangan dan perkhidmatan yang dibayar oleh pengguna dalam satu tempoh masa tertentu. Senarai barangan dan perkhidmatan dalam IHP adalah berasaskan maklumat perbelanjaan purata sebuah keluarga yang diperolehi melalui Kajian Perbelanjaan Keluarga. CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI), NOVEMBER 2014

1. *The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for November 2014 decreased by 0.2 per cent over October 2014.*
2. *A decrease of 1.4 per cent was recorded in Transport due to lower cost of motor vehicles as well as passenger transport by air. Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages decreased by 0.2 per cent due to lower prices of fresh fish and seafood, meat, and coffee, tea and cocoa. Recreation and Culture also decreased 0.1 per cent due lower cost of computers and computer accessories, unrecorded recording media, games, toys and hobbies, articles for pets, magazines and periodicals as well as stationery and drawing materials.*
3. *On the other hand, an increase of 0.6 per cent was recorded in Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance due to higher cost of household textiles, glassware, tableware and household utensils as well as other non-durable household goods. Miscellaneous Goods and Services increased by 0.5 per cent due to higher prices of non-electric appliances for personal care, articles for personal hygiene, beauty products as well as travel goods and bags. Restaurants and Hotels also increased by less than 0.05 per cent due to higher prices of selected food items from restaurants and cafés as well as accommodation services.*

4. *CPI for November 2014 decreased by 1.3 per cent compared to November 2013, largely due to lower indices of Transport; Clothing and Footwear; and Recreation and Culture.*

5. *CPI is a measure of price changes of goods and services paid by the consumer in a specified period. The list of goods and services in the CPI is based on the average expenditure per household from the Household Expenditure Survey.
